
The Town Croft Committee installed a new recycled bench in the playground this autumn. The Croft benches have suffered from vandalism in the last few years and were in need of attention. The Council has completed repair works and is hoping to replace more benches in due course, subject to funding. The new bench has been welcomed by visiting parents and will hopefully mean no more maintenance and vandalism headaches.

They will remain on the register for 5 years and the land registry will be notified. These are important community assets and the Parish Council is pleased with the outcome.

WW 1 and the Canadian Winnie the Pooh connection



When travelling recently in northern Ontario, Canada, through a small town called White River, we came across the origin of the Winnie the Pooh stories.

In August 1914, on his way to Europe to fight in World War 1, Lieutenant Harry Colebourn, a Vet, purchased a black bear cub as a mascot and named her Winnie after his home town of Winnipeg.

On arrival in Europe Winnie was left in the care of London Zoo where A.A. Milne and son Christopher visited. The rest, as they say, is history.

White River, which is a pretty remote town and a stop on the Canadian Pacific railway, with no road connection until 1960, makes a bit more of its Winnie the Pooh connection than we do in Hartfield as you can see from this roadside memorial. There is also a Museum in the town.

History Corner - The Village Green

The earliest available record of the Village Green is a map of 1597 where it is designated as 'Hartfield Grene' owned by the Buckhurst estate as it is today. In 1713 it was let to Nicholas Pope and later in 1842 to the Village Doctor William Wallis it is assumed for the use of grazing cattle. Cattle fairs and other travelling fairs also used the green with local children using it for games such as cricket.

During World War II the Green was requisitioned by the military, as was the Town Croft. In 1947 the sum of £15 was paid by the Government for the reparation for war damage and no doubt the cows were soon back.

In 1977 Mrs Marguerite Harvey left money in her will for footpaths across the green. The new footpaths were described as 'a minefield of cow pats'! Farmer Rob Medhurst replied to complaints" that the cows had been there first and people could take them cow pats home and I won't charge them" The initial registration of the land giving protected Village Green status was made on the 21st June 1968 and was made final by the Commons Commissioner on 19th February 1975. There is no provision in the act for removing village greens from the register, as the aim of registration was to protect the land in perpetuity. The Green remains an important open space which can be enjoyed today.
