Our architect has now completed the necessary drawings and specifications will soon go out to selected contractors we feel are suitable to carry out the conversion of this fine old building; a rare piece of industrial heritage in Hartfield.

If you have visited or driven past the old coalyard in recent days, I am sure you will have been surprised to see how rapidly the nine affordable houses are being erected. The car park has been completed, providing many more spaces for parents who drive to the playschool and users of the Forest Way, easing some congestion on the High Street. I have had many very positive

comments from mothers with children at the playschool. The next phase in the car park will be the planting of suitable shrubs and trees. The plan remains the same, the lower half will be converted meeting room, where we hope historical items, documents of the village may also be stored and half will be converted into two one bedroom flats.

May 5th 2011 marks the end of the current term of office for the Parish Council. The present councillors will stand down and some will put themselves up for re-election. There will be vacancies for new councillors. FASTER BROADBAND FOR HARTFIELD?



Faster 40Mbps broadband is being rolled out around the country, but rural areas may be amongst the last to benefit. BT has launched "The Race to Infinity" - a competition offering rural communities the chance to be upgraded early if enough people register their interest. If BT upgrades the exchanges and the infrastructure, then users of other suppliers' internet services can also benefit. If you want a

2011 NATIONAL CENSUS "Help tomorrow take shape"

On 27TH March 2011, all residential households in the United Kingdom will be taking part in a census. Since 1801 a day has been chosen every ten years for this purpose. The census provides an excellent source of information about the population. This enables central and local government, health authorities and many other organizations to identify need for housing, education, health and transport services for years to come.

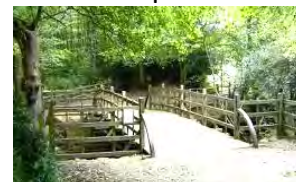


The census statistics also feed into the allocation of funding for local authorities and plays a major part in identifying need for local services in communities, so it is crucial the population estimate is as accurate as possible. When the questionnaire envelope comes through the door you'll easily recognize it by the purple 2011 Census logo. Take care of it. If, like many people, you want to complete the questionnaire online, your individual internet code will be on the front of the questionnaire. The diversion order for the new path from Marsh Green was published for the period of public consultation. Hartfield Parish Council supported the proposal and there are no outstanding objection which means the project now enters the next phase. This involves arranging more legal notices in the press and on-site, and there then follows a period of 6 weeks during which objections can be made on the grounds of incorrect legal procedure having been followed. In the meantime, plans are being prepared for the construction of the new car park and additional new paths which are connected to the diversion.



Let's hope the spring sees the new route being enjoyed by locals and visitors alike.

Lamberts Negotiations are in progress to make the Lamberts permissive bridleway a permanent right of way for riders and walkers. Hopefully there will be good news in our next newsletter.

1. People in East Sussex urged to use full range of NHS services

Our Doctors report that all Practices within our area have been asked to look at the provision of minor injuries services as a way to reduce pressure on Accident and Emergency Services. Some minor injuries can be dealt with in the surgery between 08.30 and 18.00. These would include uncomplicated head injuries; wounds that might need dressing, steri-strips or sutures; simple burns and scalds; and falls with low likelihood of fractures. Outside of these hours and when you feel it is appropriate the minor injuries unit at Crowborough Hospital is open from 08.00 to 20.00 and there is a minor injuries unit also at the Queen Victoria Hospital in East Grinstead.

Remember you can also get expert advice from your local pharmacy. You can go online to www.nhsdirect.nhs.uk or call NHS Direct Tel 0845 4647. NHS Direct is open 24 hours a day and can give you help and advice, as well as opening times for all out-of-hours NHS services and local pharmacies.
