CORONATION OF KING CHARLES III

The coronation ceremony for our new King his Majesty King Charles the third will be taking place on Saturday the 6th of May. Guidelines from the Department for Levelling Up, headed by the Rt. Honourable MP Michael Gove, suggest events across the country run by local organisations should be encouraged, although it is accepted this will not be on the scale of last year's jubilee celebrations by request from the palace, but there will be lots going on! Saturday the 6th will be the actual Coronation Day which will be broadcast live from Westminster Abbey. Sunday the 7th is to be known as the 'big lunch' where local organisations will be encouraged to come together in some form of



celebration. The evening will see a concert which will be broadcast live from Windsor Castle. The bank holiday Monday, the 8th, is to be known as the help-out day. The idea behind this is for people to get involved in things like local litter picking, helping on communal gardens etc. Here in Hartfield Parish, there will also be things happening. In Coleman's Hatch, in coordination with the Church, a lunch is taking place. The Gallipot public house will also be putting on events to celebrate and the Anchor public house will be having a hog roast and live music.

If you or your local organisation are interested in putting on an event over this historical weekend please let your local Parish Council know what you are planning in order that the people of Hartfield Parish can be kept up to date with events and we can advertise what is happening in our village.

Following the snow fall in December that led to many cars and their occupants being stranded in and around the Village, the group updating the Hartfield Emergency Plan met again in the village hall with Paula Jones & Andrew Polley to discuss the response to the snow event before Christmas. Andrew Polley opened up the village hall, and Mike & Liz Colenutt provided refreshments into the early hours of the morning for those who were stranded. It was agreed that social media had been instrumental in raising awareness of the issues but there had been

no formal "invocation" of the emergency plan. Setting up an Emergency WhatsApp group was proposed to resolve this issue. There is still work to be done on the Emergency Plan, especially in respect of the need to engage with residents. If you are interested in helping to develop this plan, particularly if you are a local Farmer or Landowner who may have access to vehicles and equipment that could be utilised in any future weather event, please contact the Parish Clerk. Finally, an updated list of vulnerable people in the Parish has been produced and this will be used to update the latest version of the plan. HARTFIELD VILLAGE FETE

The AGM was held on the 21st of February. Although there was a good turnout it was noticeable that some local clubs and organisations were not represented in spite of several reminders.

It had been made very clear in advance that without increased support from the people in the Parish, the future of the village fete was in jeopardy. However, the enthusiasm from those in attendance gave the existing committee enough confidence to stand again and they were duly elected, plus several new committee members.

In 2022 the committee adopted the idea that some stalls should be run by local clubs and organisations and that this would include setting up, running and taking down their own stalls. The benefit was that any money then made by these organisations on their individual stalls would be kept by them rather than applying for a share of the fete profits which were made and subsequently distributed to local good causes. This idea worked extremely well and took a lot of pressure off the organisers of the fete. It was unanimously agreed this system should be adopted again in 2023. Any clubs or organisations who are interested should contact myself if they want to be involved in the 2023 fete. We also hired in marquees and a sound system which also took a lot of pressure off the fete committee, although obviously reduced the overall profitability. There were some fears that after a gap of three years the fete would not be so well attended but after a slower start than usual the fete was its usual busy and successful occasion, also helped by the guest appearance of Zippy, Sooty and Sweep from children's TV, all kept under control by their puppeteer Ronnie Le Drew.

The bar, as usual, was also a huge success with record sales of Pimms, being the drink of choice. The barbecue was also very busy from the offset.

The fete for 2023 will be held on Saturday 2nd of September. If anyone is interested in becoming involved, please join us for what is always a fun and rewarding day and the highlight of our village calendar. The committee would be very pleased to hear from people willing to volunteer both prior to, on the day, and after the fete.
