### **Parish Council Review**

Welcome to the Summer newsletter. I hope everyone is enjoying the recent warm weather, I am hoping it will continue across the remaining summer months.

Some may have noticed that the Parish Council has moved out of Goods Yard House. This is a temporary situation and is to allow some remedial work to be carried out which will take several months. There are more details later in this newsletter.

I would like to draw your attention to the request, included in an article below, to update our Community Resilience Plan and I urge you to complete and return the questionnaire enclosed with this newsletter.

The grant scheme was again open for local groups in 2019 and this year the Parish Council approved grants of almost £5,500. These will support a set of diverse local groups, including Youth Groups, the Wealdlink bus service, Hartfield Village Hall, the School, the Scouts, Guides and Brownies.

On the subject of local groups, I keep hearing a need for volunteers to help run these services for our community. If you have some time and want to get involved in helping, for example with the fete, memorial garden, village hall or rights of way working parties, please get in touch for contact information.

As a reminder, the Hartfield Village Fete, Horticultural and Dog Show is on the 7th September on the Town Croft.

Finally, I would like to thank Stephen Howard for his time as a Parish Councillor and to welcome a new Councillor, Jackie Wood who joined us in June.

#### Hartfield Community Resilience Plan



Together with this newsletter you will find a questionnaire entitled Hartfield Emergency Plan. It is not that we would wish to alarm anyone (far from it), but we hope you will agree that it is quite sensible for your Parish Council to prepare a contingency plan to deal with those unexpected natural events such as flood, storm, fire, or perhaps those man-made incidents such as crashes (road or air) that could adversely affect the parish and the people living in it, particularly considering that we are a rural community and may need to be self-reliant until the official emergency services arrive. In order for it to be 'fit for purpose' it is essential that Hartfield's Emergency Plan (first created in 2014) needs to be revised and periodically updated. Therefore, we are asking you to read the attached document and if you think that you have something to offer the community in the event of an emergency, please complete the enclosed questionnaire and return it to the Parish Clerk c/o Goods Yard House, Edenbridge Road, Hartfield, TN7 4JG. Needless to say, all the information supplied to us

will be held in strictest confidence in accordance with the General Data Protection Act- (GDPR).

When VE day dawns on the 8th May 2020 it will be 75 years since the guns fell silent marking the end of the second world war in Europe. This 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary will provide our nation, and our friends around the world, with an opportunity to reflect on the enormous sacrifice, courage and determination of people from all walks of life who saw us through this dark and terrifying period in our history.

To commemorate this important time, we are organising VE day 75. An international celebration that will take place on 8<sup>th</sup> May 2020. It will be an opportunity for us to remember the enormous sacrifices that were made at home and abroad and to joyously celebrate, as people did here in our village of Hartfield 75 years ago, the arrival of peace in Europe. Friday 8th May has been designated a bank holiday to enable as many people as possible to join in the celebrations, so we do hope you will find time to take part in our tribute to those who gave so much to ensure we are all able to enjoy the freedom we have today. Our plans are still in the very early stages, but events will include a street party, entertainers, a hog roast and other similar activities that reflect the period 75 years ago. The more formal events we would like to include are the ringing of our Church bells to be timed to coincide with churches across our nation and a formal toast to the heroes of World War II and the lighting of our beacon along with the lowering of the flag.


