

Parish Council Summer Newsletter 2018

In our last newsletter, we announced that the Parish Council was looking to develop a Parish Plan in consultation with residents of the parish. At the Annual Meeting in April, we introduced some of the initial thinking and I wanted to thank all those who contributed to the discussion and left their thoughts on the feedback boards. Since then, we have had lively and interesting discussions at the monthly council meetings on youth projects and engagement, as well as on highways and community initiatives. Please keep an eye on our agenda for those areas that interest you.

Once again, the grant scheme was open for local groups in 2018. The Parish Council approved grants of £5,600 this year to support a variety of local organisations, including youth groups, Hartfield Village Hall, the Scouts, Guides, the Weald Link bus service, the WI and the Ashdown Forest Conservators.

This is a time of continued pressure on all levels of Local Government. East Sussex County Council have announced additional savings of £17m from their 2018/19 budget and that further savings will be required in future years. This is going to impact a number of services they provide, including front line services, such as adult social care, and the closure of the Forest Row and Wadhurst recycling sites. Another example of cuts is from the maintenance of hedges and verges and grass cutting, where the Parish Council took the decision to finance an equivalent service this year from our reserves.

The Clerk has liaised with Wealden to chase up collections, but if residents can also remind Wealden then it adds to the urgency. The Council in partnership with Youth Voice have supplied a new refuse bin near the youth shelter to help keep the Croft tidy. The Clerk has asked for more dog fouling signage from Wealden and the Parish Council has installed several dog waste bag dispensers which are regularly refilled by our Councillor volunteers so there is no excuse.

sacrifice of millions of men and women by taking part in "Battle's Over", a unique series of events involving organizations and communities the length and breadth of our nation and in many countries abroad.


The tribute will begin with the usual Remembrance Day Service at St Mary's Church - November 11th at 10.45am. The colour party of wreaths, standards and their accompaniment will gather in The Anchor car park at 10.20am and will then proceed up to the church to join the rest of the congregation. The service will commence at 10.45am. At 11am we will hold the two-minute silence. This will be preceded by the reading of the names of all those from this parish who have died during the two world wars and other conflicts. The service lasts about an hour and is completed when the congregation will process to the War Memorial in the High Street where the wreaths will be laid and Standards dipped. The special tribute will begin at 6.30pm at the Memorial Gardens, Hartfield and will start with the distribution of candles to the children of the village followed by readings from Reverend Julie.

The names of the fallen from the parish will again be read out, followed by the last post which will be sounded at exactly 6.55pm. At 7.00pm, a beacon of light will be lit symbolizing the "end of the darkness" of the First World War. At 7.05pm, the Church bells will ring out in a "celebration of peace. Across our nation, all those taking part will adhere to the same timing. Please join us! Those millions of brave men along with the many men and women left at home, did their duty for their country during the dark days of war, so let us do our duty by them, remembering and honouring them through "Battle's Over".

A new fire beacon will be constructed in the village to mark this occasion and for future occasions when it's use is considered appropriate. Any donations towards the funding of this new landmark will be very gratefully received. We also welcome suggestions for the siting of such a beacon from Parishioners.

Wealdlink Community Transport

Saturday Bus to Hartfield - The Wealdlink Saturday bus service 262 operates from Hartfield High Street to Uckfield via Nutley and Maresfield. The service is designed to connect with the 291 services from East Grinstead and Tunbridge Wells. Service 262's route to Nutley is via the B2026 and therefore offers visitors to Hartfield an alternative to car travel when visiting Pooh Bridge, Gills Lap, Kings Standing and other Ashdown Forest attractions. The service is operated by WEALDLINK Community Transport and funded by Maresfield, Uckfield and Framfield Parish Councils and a grant from Hartfield Parish Council. For the time being the 262 also continues to Heathfield High Street. This Saturday service is daytime only leaving Hartfield at 09:15, 11:15 and 13:15 returning from Uckfield at 10:37, 12:37 and 14:37.

Complaints about Helicopter Operations and Noise

Individuals wishing to make representations about policy aspects of civil helicopter operations can do so by telephoning the DFT's Aviation Environmental Division (AED) (020 7944 5796). Similarly, the Home Office Police Aviation Advisor (020 7217 8293) may be contacted over policy for police helicopters and the Ministry of Defence (020 7218 4664) for military helicopters. Complaints about noise should be made to the relevant local authority, police force or military air station. It is better to do this as soon as possible after, or even during the event. If any helicopter is thought to be flying dangerously or is for another reason outside the law, the Air Regulation Enforcement and Investigation Branch of the Civil Aviation Authority may be contacted at CAA House, 45-59 Kingsway, London WC2B 6TE (Tel: 020 7379-7311).

The British Helicopter Association (Tel: 01276-856100) may be able to help identify a civil helicopter if an accurate description of the time, place and aircraft can be given.
