Here are some basic pointers from the NHS that will help to avoid catching or spreading coronavirus.

Do

- wash your hands with soap and water often do this for at least 20 seconds
- always wash your hands when you get home or into work
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap/water are not available
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards
- try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell

do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean

HARTFIELD VILLAGE HALL as previously reported 2020 marks the Centenary year following the building of Hartfield Village Hall for all parishioners in 1920. The committee had agreed to join with the 75th anniversary of VE Day celebrations in the village planning an exhibition in the hall of memorabilia from the Parish historical archives. Sadly, due to the devastating effect of Covid 19 virus, this has had to be cancelled but we hope we can re-schedule later in the year. The popular lunch club has been cancelled. The hall is a hub for the youth organisations who store most of their equipment there and each group is presently making their own decision on whether to continue meeting. Whilst the hall is cleaned regularly and thoroughly it is not possible to disinfect all surfaces every day between users so hall users need to ensure strict hygiene standards are maintained themselves.. At the time of writing the hall has not actually been closed yet but the situation is very fluid and it may well have done so by the time you read this. Some good news amongst the gloom, work has commenced on improving the path at the side or the hall and we are delighted to announce that at last work is also scheduled to begin later this month in refurbishing the disabled toilet and making it accessible from the inside lobby, it will also house a baby changing unit. Once this work is completed, we will turn our attention to modernising the present ladies and gents' facilities.
