I applaud all of our local businesses and offer a special thanks to those who supported our community during lockdown and are delivering to our community members who are shielding. I was also thrilled to hear that the Hartfield Village Store and Perryhill Orchards were both awarded a Wealden Hero award by Nus Ghani. We have all had to adapt and we have, from wearing face masks, social distancing, to our local pubs' creative COVID safe ways to continue to serve our community.

COVID dominates our headlines these days, but I must also push through an additional useful piece of information. A new defibrillator will be installed at Central Garage partly funded by the British Heart Foundation and the Parish Council. There are three now in the parish, the other ones are at the Village Hall and Trinity Hall. We thank Central Garage for hosting this device. Training will be available when possible and a date will be advertised.

We await to see what lies around the next COVID bend in the road. In the meantime, we are safe in each other's capable hands. Keep well.

COUNCIL ARRANGEMENTS AND MEETINGS. Please note during the current corona virus outbreak the Council will not be meeting formally in person and until regulations change, we will continue with virtual meetings. Agendas and papers will continue to be placed on the council website and if you wish to attend a meeting please contact the Clerk for joining information.

We will confirm new meeting dates and arrangements when we can. In the meantime, correspondence, planning applications and payments will be responded to by the Clerk to the Council in consultation with councillors. Please email or call the office in the normal way and we will respond as soon as possible.

The Council has continued to make decisions and actioned various items through this period including:

- Setting up and managing a volunteer group database.
- Dealing with enquiries from residents and volunteer organisations and WDC.
- Keeping up to date will all legislation to ensure our buildings and playground are safe.
- Arranging risk assessments and installing hand sanitizer units and notices in our buildings.
- Completion of the new Council website so we are compliant with accessibility legislation.
- Overseeing maintenance increased works due to small scale vandalism.
- Climate change declaration and action plan for the Council to work to have been approved.
- Finalising playground resurfacing and new climbing equipment in time for re-opening date.
- Changing our banking arrangements to reduce costs and ensure better value for money.

In our plans for future expenditure next year we are looking towards ways of improving the roof and efficiency of our ageing Sports Pavilion on the Town Croft.

HARTFIELD MARKS 75 YEARS OF PEACE



As a community we were hoping to get together on 8th May to celebrate 75 years since the village originally marked Victory in Europe. Like so many events this year, we were forced by Covid-19 to cancel the planned street party and lighting of the village beacon. Not to be deterred from showing our thanks to those who achieved so much on our behalf, the organising committee felt that we should not let the moment pass unmarked. We decided that we should hold a service in secret that also respected social distancing. Reverend Julie Sear was granted permission by the Diocese to hold the service, so long as it was not publicised beforehand. She was also granted permission to ring a single bell in the church, so long as the ringer and their safety bell ringer lived together. The service was held at the lesser used war memorial in the churchyard and was recorded

by Neil and Samantha Reed from Pooh Corner who filmed the occasion so that it could be shared among the community and beyond on social media. Cllr Colin Burnett Dick laid a wreath on behalf of the Parish and Cllr Robert Nathan read the Kohima Prayer. The names of those who are on the war memorials at Coleman's Hatch, Holtye and Hartfield were read, and Toby Castle rang an original 'Victory Bell' to mark the occasions

Our Union and Royal British Legion Standards were also paraded as part of a nationwide 'virtual parade' held in our own gardens. Neil and Sam also recorded the doorstep street party held in the High Street that captured the festive spirit of the day. Their films have been seen as far away as Australia, Borneo, Malaysia and Canada. The family of one of our local casualties responded from Canada "A wonderful tribute and reminder of the sacrifice made by so many to bring us to a place of peace. Thanks for keeping their memory respected and alive." On 15th August a similar service was held to commemorate 75 years since VJ Day which marked the end of the Second World War. Reverend Julie led us in giving thanks to all those who served and poems were read on the theme of Coming Home, Neil generously filmed the occasion which also featured readings by Pauline Burnett-Dick and Trevor Sear. Although the service could not be made public due to social distancing, we hope that all parishioners will appreciate that this was necessary during lockdown.

At present, plans for Remembrance Sunday are being considered, though this may not take its usual form. More details will be made public closer to the time when we know what restrictions may be in place. Sadly, it looks as though the national Poppy Appeal will be dramatically affected and there may not be any face to face contact on the streets or doorsteps. I know that this will disappoint many of you, not least our dedicated team of local collectors. More details will be publicised closer to the time.

I would like to thank all those who were involved in marking both VE75 and VJ57, especially Reverend Julie who makes Remembrance in our parish so poignant.

Just before Covid 19 struck, the Committee had used grant money and savings to allow us to complete the long-awaited refurbishment of the toilets, Ladies, Gents and also the former outside disabled toilet making it now accessible from the inner lobby by the Kitchen and Inkpen Room alongside the others. Sadly, the Pandemic then took hold and all bookings were cancelled. The hall has now been thoroughly cleaned according to Government Guidelines with distance markers and hand sanitizers available and

anybody entering the building must seek permission from our bookings clerk Paula Jones 07973 448494 and sign in for track and trace. Fortunately, the office upstairs has been rented out which brings in a little income but like many venues our regular income stream was frozen and sadly regular bookings enjoyed by villagers such as the Lunch Club, WI, History Group, & Youth Groups have all temporarily ceased. The committee of the Hall which is **OWNED BY ALL PARISHIONERS** is delighted one or two small groups such as the Art Group Tues 9.30 -12. Silver Swans 9.30-10.30 Friday and Martial Arts on Saturday morning are starting again with limited numbers whilst observing the Covid guidelines.
